#### **Participants**

The target audience of the seminar is older participants (50+) in voluntary arts and culture associations. The number of participants will be at least 30, with 6 from each of the five participating countries.

Furthermore, the partnership circle will be represented by at least 10 project members - with 2 or more from each country.

The total number of persons will thereby be approx. 45.

#### Language used

The working language is English, and the course materials will be provided in English.

Participants are expected to have good communicative skills in English. However, most participants are not native speakers of English and do not use complicated language.

# Aims and methodology

#### Aims and objectives

The overall aim of the seminar is to qualify the outcome of the project by getting feedback and new input from the invited group of experienced elder active participants in voluntary arts and culture.

The objectives are through exchange of experiences and dialogue with the participants

- to qualify our understanding of the learning benefits of voluntary arts and culture, seen from a personal perspective;
- to clarify the best practice and essentials of learning highlights in voluntary arts and culture, seen from a personal perspective;
- to outline essential hints or focus points of the specific values of art based learning for active ageing, seen from a societal perspective;
- to clarify hints and focus points for profiling and raising awareness of the importance of art based learning for active ageing, seen from a societal perspective.

# Methodology

The seminar will be based on participatory and activity-based methods, and the intercultural learning about each other at the professional and the personal level will be a cross-curricular topic.

The seminar will focus on knowledge exchange and shared experiences. There will be a blend of presentations of the pilot work, external lectures, group work, and plenum discussions.

## Preparation and follow-up

The participants will latest 3 weeks before the course receive seminar materials, including a basic text on the topic helping the participants to get acquainted with the relevant English vocabulary.

The participants will after the seminar fill-out an evaluation questionnaire about the setting of the seminar, the effectiveness of the programme, the contents transferred, the outcome and hopes realized, etc.

Furthermore, the participants will have access to the written presentations, the summaries of the group and plenum discussions, including a summary of the seminar evaluations. We will also encourage the participants to develop network and further transnational cooperation.

#### D'n Ark - Sense the flavours of a small Dutch province

D'n Ark is founded by Joost van Roosmalen and has the goal to let everyone experience how tasteful and green the province of Brabant is and how many great producers and amazing products you can find in this part of the Netherlands. #### Sunday evening: City walk - Trajectum Lumen (A Utrecht tale of light)

It's an age-old tale, tried and true. Even the Romans knew that Utrecht was unique. And so, around 50 A.D., they made their camp at the present location of Domplein. Ever since, this city in the heart of the Netherlands has always been full of activity. Trajectum Lumen pays homage to the rich history of Utrecht, with an eye-catching light art trail, which is free for all to enjoy 365 nights a year.

Trajectum Lumen is an exploration after dark, which follows artistically lit locations throughout Utrecht's historical city centre. When night falls, Trajectum Lumen leads from centrally located Vredenburg past a growing number of installations by (inter)nationally renowned light artists. Since its launch in the spring of 2010, an increasing amount of light artworks have emerged along the route. Together, they illuminate this city's past and present in spectacular fashion.

# Monday 17.00 - 18.00: Paushuize guided tour


According to Carel Huydecoper, curator of the Paushuize (Papal Palace), a guided tour of the magnificent Paushuize cannot be missed. With its rich history, the Paushuize is among the most spectacular historical buildings in Utrecht. It owes its name to the only Dutch pope ever, Adrianus VI, who had the house built from 1517. A wide selection of brilliant period rooms and beautifully decorated drawing rooms ensure this city palace is one of the most splendid locations in the Netherlands.

Guides show the best halls of the Paushuize, where the history of building construction, the archaeological findings and interesting object as regards art history are dealt with.
